

The sledding hill will be lit during the Warming House Season until 10:00 pm. When you use the hill for sledding, you assume full risk and responsibility for determining that the conditions are safe for sledding.



HOCKEY RINK RESERVATIONS INFORMATION

Hockey Rinks can be reserved for youth hockey practice for a fee of \$15 for the warming house season. Hockey rink reservations can be made Monday-Friday for 1-hour time periods with a maximum of 2 practices per week. Reservations need to be made at least one week prior to the first reservation date. 
FAMILY FUN NIGHT

The Dust Bowl was a period of severe dust storms that greatly damaged the ecology and agriculture of the US and Canadian prairies during the 1930's; severe drought and a failure to apply dry land farming methods to prevent wind erosion caused the phenomenon. 
CRYSTAL DOG PARK

A special area in Bassett Creek Park has been designed for canine companions. This fenced-in area has lots of space to roam off-leash to exercise and socialize your dog. Park hours are 6:00 am-10:00 pm. The park is free.

- No children allowed without adult supervision.
- Owners must clean up and properly dispose of feces.
- Dogs must be on leashes prior to entering and leaving the area.
- No grooming in the dog park and surrounding area.
- No food – human or pet – allowed.
- Pets need to be properly licensed and vaccinated.
- Owners must have verbal control of their pet(s) and must prevent aggressive behavior and excessive barking. Aggressive dogs must be removed immediately.
- Never leave dogs unattended. Owners are legally responsible for their dogs and any injuries or damage caused by them.
- Dogs in heat are not allowed inside the park.
- Dogs registered as dangerous in any jurisdiction are not allowed.

Crystal City Park Map

The City of Crystal has more than 240 acres dedicated to parks and open space. The city maintains 27 parks as well as numerous ball fields, courts, playgrounds, trails and activity areas.



Crystal City Parks are open daily from sunrise to 10 p.m. Please follow all regulations when visiting the parks:

- Dispose of all debris and litter in trash cans.
- Picnic fires are prohibited except in designated areas.
- Do not damage or harm park wildlife or plantlife.
- Dogs must be leashed with a leash shorter than 6 feet.
- Beer and liquor is prohibited except by permit.
- Do not damage or deface park property.
- No skating on tennis courts or playground equipment.
- Dog walkers must possess waste removing utensils.


