



The Crystal Parks and Recreation Departments are actively seeking community or neighborhood oriented groups to join the PARK PRIDE program. This program fits nicely with groups looking for a community service projects and neighborhood groups that want to clean up, beautify and develop pride in the parks in our community.

This program requires a minimum of two clean up visits to a specific park location in a one year period, and/or to provide a “Park Watch” service on a year round bases. This program is open to community groups, civic organizations, churches, families and individual citizens. Park site are chosen on a first come, first serve basis. Objective:

To organize a community effort to clean up, beautify and develop pride in the parks in the community. To conduct a program that accomplishes a meaningful purpose towards keeping clean and well maintained neighborhood parks, and keeping the parks free of vandalism and other illegal activities.

Process:

- Interested organizations, groups, or individual citizen will contact the Recreation Department. At this time we will also determine a volunteer leader for the group.
- Crystal Recreation Department PARK PRIDE PROGRAM guidelines, wavier form, and additional program information will be mailed out to the interested party.
- Once the wavier form has been completed and returned to the Recreation Department the organization may select the dates for the park clean up.
- The volunteer leader will receive Park Ordinances, directional information, safety information, and park watch information.

- Volunteer leader will then contact the Recreation Department one week prior to the clean ups, and will need to pick up the equipment provided by the Parks and Recreation Department at the Crystal Community Center (Monday - Thursday, 8:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.; Friday, 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.).
- Volunteer leader may contact the Recreation Department following the clean up to report any vandalism, safety concerns, or comments on the designated park.
- PARK PRIDE PROGRAM volunteers can make periodical inspections of the designated park and report any problem or concerns to the proper agencies.
- Organizations, groups or individual citizen will have the option after two years to resign a contract for another two years.



Participants Guidelines:

- Age group - 12 and over (participants under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult)
- Must read over safety guideline, park ordinances and park watch information
- All volunteers must sign a waiver form
- General supervision to be provided by the Recreation and/or Parks Department

Two Year Participation Commitment:

This program requires a minimum of a two year commitment to the park that has been adopted. Also two clean up visits must be completed in a one year period, and/or provide a “Park Watch” service on a year round bases.

Tasks:

- To be aware of violations of park ordinances and communicate these to the Crystal Police Department.
- Clean up tasks could include but are not limited to:
 - Trash pick-up
 - Brush clean-up
 - Trail maintenance
 - Light maintenance of park building/shelter
 - Vandal repair
 - Tree wrapping

Equipment provided by Parks and Recreation Department:

- Gloves
- Reflective vests where needed
- Personal protection gear where needed (hard hats, eye protection, dust mask)
- Trash bags
- Paint brushes when needed
- Crime Prevention Information

Supervision:

- General supervision to be provided by Parks and Recreation Department.
- Youth groups must provide chaperones and maintain a 1:10 ratio.

Reward:

- Free use of the park selected for group events
- Recognition in the City Newsletter and the POST as well as at the Crystal Community Center
- A sign will be put up at each park saying: *This park is currently adopted by a neighborhood group. Please Help in their efforts to keep it clean.*
