THE RESERVE UNIT

The Crystal Police Reserve Unit is made up of men and women who volunteer their time and effort to help make The City of Crystal a safe and enjoyable community in which to live work and play.

The Reserve Officers assist The Crystal Police Department with both police related and civic duties.

Programs and Committees in the Unit include:

- **Bike Patrol**
- **Squad Patrol**
- **Bike Rodeo Committee**
- **New Reserve Hiring Committee**



RESERVE OFFICER DUTIES

Crystal Police Reserves assist the Police Officers with vehicle tows, house checks, transports, medicals, vehicle lockouts, animal complaints and traffic control. Many of these duties are performed during Reserve squad patrol on Friday and Saturday Nights from 7:00pm to 3:00am.

They also assist with civic events such as:

- **Parades**
- **City Festival**
- **School Events**
- **Community Center Events**
- **Athletic Events**
- **Airport Open House**
- **National Night Out**

The duties that Reserve Officers perform are suited for adults of all ages who are community minded and want to improve the quality of life in Crystal.

The time commitment involves a minimum of 15 hours per month. A uniform and equipment is furnished

TRAINING

Reserves enter a field training period with The Crystal Police Department. Reserve Officers must also attend the Hennepin County Reserve School. This is a thirty hour course that runs from January to mid March. The topics taught help prepare the Reserve Officer with work in their community.

Additional training is provided that includes:

- **First Responder, basic and refresher courses**
- **Use of handcuffs, pepper spray and baton**
- **Traffic direction**
- **Water and ice rescue**
- **Medical and field training scenarios**

Reserve Officers are required to attend one monthly meeting, generally held on Tuesdays at the Crystal Police Department.
