

## Information

- The soil profile of this garden allows for rapid infiltration of water. This raingarden is designed to be dry within 48 hours.
- Plants for this garden were chosen for their ability to thrive in part sun, periodically moist conditions. Their location within the garden is based on their moisture requirements.

- Perennials may be divided (or seeds collected) and shared with neighbors and friends as the plantings mature and become too crowded.
- Fertilizer is not necessary.
- The City will assist with maintenance for the first two Springs following the initial plantings.

## Maintenance

- Weeding will be especially important as the perennials are maturing, however, as the perennials grow they will out-compete the weeds. Mulch will also help to smother a majority of the weeds.
- Watering will be necessary as the plants are establishing, especially if there is no rain.
- In Spring, trim previous year's foliage to ground after perennials have 4" of new growth.
- Mulch should be replenished every few years to smother weeds and preserve soil moisture.


